



Chemours Position Statement on Responsible Mining

Chemours produces minerals to meet societal needs. Our minerals enable Chemours and our customers to develop products that make our communities safer, environment cleaner, technologies more effective and the future more sustainable.

Chemours is committed to mining responsibly in all areas where we extract precious minerals for commercial and industrial use. We strive to be good stewards of the lands we own and lease to support our operations. We align our approach to managing land use and biodiversity with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. Our mines are planned, operated, and restored with an eye toward leaving things better than we started and minimizing the potential for adverse effects. Natural resources such as wetlands and groundwater are protected by thorough planning and design, including the input of local stakeholders. To ensure the continued effectiveness of our environmental stewardship measures, we routinely monitor our operations and undertake research on a variety of topics such as the local and regional groundwater system and partnerships to advance gopher tortoise conservation.

We are keenly aware of the importance of the Okefenokee Swamp as an ecological and cultural natural resource, and its value to the community and other stakeholders. We are committed to ensure the value of the Okefenokee is maintained. With respect to future mining next to the Okefenokee, Chemours has no plans to open new mining locations on Trail Ridge in Georgia next to the Okefenokee. We believe that we can optimize our existing mining locations in Georgia and Florida to sustain operations well into the 2030s.

With respect to mining activities of others, particularly Twin Pines, Chemours has no role in the proposed Twin Pines project in Charlton County, Georgia. We have no previous, existing, or future interest in acquiring, and no plans or intent to acquire, the project or the company. We have no intention or plans, now and for the foreseeable future (the next five to ten years), of doing business with Twin Pines, including buying from the project or any titanium the project produces.

The Chemours mining team strives to continually engage with stakeholders to understand concerns about our mining activities, to work collaboratively to improve our performance, and to communicate transparently. When planning new mines or significant modifications we reach out to stakeholders early in the process so that they can meaningfully participate in shaping our operations. Our facilities are routinely showcased to groups interested in learning more or providing input regarding our activities.
